## **ABOUT THIS GUIDE**

This guide on using the IdcCommand and IdcCommandX utilities to access to the content and content management functions within Stellent Content Server. The Stellent IdcCommand Java Command Utility is a stand-alone Java application that enables users to execute content server services.

#### **Audience**

This guide is intended for application developers who need to access Stellent Content Server functions.

#### **Conventions**

The following conventions are used throughout this guide:

- ❖ The notation <*install\_dir*>/ is used throughout this guide to refer to the location on your system where Stellent Content Server product is installed.
- ❖ Forward slashes (/) are used to separate the directory levels in a path name. A forward slash will always appear after the end of a directory name.
- Notes, technical tips, important notices, and cautions use these conventions:

# IDCCOMMAND: JAVA COMMAND UTILITY

## **CONCEPTUAL OVERVIEW**

The IdcCommand utility is a stand-alone Java application that enables users to execute content server services. The program reads a command file containing commands and parameters and calls the specified services. A log file records the time that the call was executed, whether the command was successfully executed, and if there were execution errors.

The IdcCommand utility requires a command file and content server username to execute the commands. The user must have appropriate permissions to execute the commands. Some commands will require administrative access, other commands may require only write permission.

Command options can be specified on the command line or in the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file. Specifying a command line option overrides the setting in the configuration file. See "Command Line Options" on 2-3 and "Configuration File Options" on 2-5 for additional information.

- ❖ The IdcCommandFile specifies the file containing the commands to execute. The command line option −f overrides this parameter.
- The IdcCommandUserName specifies the user permitted to run the command. The command line option -u overrides this parameter.
- ❖ The IdcCommandLog specifies the path to the log file. The command line option −1 overrides this parameter.
- ❖ The ConnectionMode specifies the connection mode for executing the commands. The command line option -c overrides this parameter.
  - If this option is not specified, the default connection mode of auto is used. In the default connection node, IdcCommand will initially attempt to connect to the server.
  - If this fails, the commands are executed in stand-alone mode.

There are certain commands that cannot be executed in stand-alone mode. In general, these commands are performed asynchronously by the server in a background thread. This happens in the update or rebuild of the search index.

Command File Syntax uses precedence to resolve conflicts among the name/value pairs within the LocalData section. Special characters specific to the command file syntax are used.

The IdcCommand utility only returns information about the success and failure of the command. To retrieve information from the server in an interactive session, use the Java COM wrapper IdcCommandX available on NT.



**Note:** See "Chapter 2: IdcCommandX" for additional information.

## **COMMAND LINE OPTIONS**

Options can be specified on the command line or in the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file. Specifying a command line option overrides the setting in the configuration file.

For example:

-f newfile.hda -u admin -l C:/stellent/newlog.txt -c server



**Note:** See "Configuration File Options" on 2-5 for additional information.

#### -f command\_file

Specifies the file containing the commands to execute. Use this parameter if the command file has the same name. Alternatively, this can be specified in the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file by setting the value of IdcCommandFile. Specifying the log file path on the command line overrides the setting in the *intradoc.cfg* file.

#### -u user name

Specifies the user permitted to run the command. Alternatively, this can be specified in the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file by setting the value of IdcCommandUserName. Specifying the log file path on the command line overrides the setting in the *intradoc.cfg* file.

### -1 log\_file

Specifies the path to the log file. As each command is executed, a message is sent to the log file. The log file contains the time the command was executed and the success or failure status. The log file can be used to relay processing information to the user. Alternatively, this can be specified in the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file by setting the value of IdcCommandLog. Specifying the log file path on the command line overrides the setting in the *intradoc.cfg* file.

- ❖ If the action performed is successful, a "success" message is written to the log file.
- If the action performed is not successful, an error message is written to the log file.
- ❖ If no log file is specified, information is logged to the screen.

#### -c connection mode

Specifies the connection mode for executing the commands. If this option is not specified, the default connection mode of auto is used. Alternatively, this can be specified in the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file by setting the value of

ConnectionMode. Specifying the connection mode on the command line overrides the setting in the *intradoc.cfg* file.

<b>Connection Mode</b>	Description	
auto	This is the default connection mode. This specifies that IdcCommand will initially attempt to connect to the server. If this fails, the commands are executed in stand-alone mode.	
server	This specifies that IdcCommand will only execute services through the server.	
standalone	This specifies that IdcCommand will execute the services in a stand-alone session.	

## **CONFIGURATION FILE OPTIONS**

Options can be specified on the command line or in the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file. Specifying a command line option overrides the setting in the configuration file. See "Command Line Options" page 2-3 for additional information.

#### For example:

IdcCommandFile=newfile.hda

IdcCommandUserName=sysadmin

IdcCommandLog=C:/stellent/newlog.txt

ConnectionMode=server

#### **IdcCommandFile**

Specifies the file containing the commands to execute. Use this parameter if the command file will always have the same name. The command line option -f overrides this parameter.

#### **IdcCommandUserName**

Specifies the user permitted to run the command. The command line option –u overrides this parameter.

#### IdcCommandLog

Specifies the path to the log file. The log file contains the time the command was executed, and the success or failure status. If no log file is specified, information is logged to the screen. The log file can be used to relay processing information to the user. As each command is executed, a message will be sent to the log file. If the action performed is successful, a "success" message is displayed. If the action performed is not successful, an error message and related information is written to the log file. The command line option -1 overrides this parameter.

#### ConnectionMode (optional)

Specifies the connection mode for executing the commands. If this option is not specified, the default connection mode of auto is used. The command line option -c overrides this parameter.

<b>Connection Mode</b>	Description	
auto	This is the default connection mode. This specifies that IdcCommand will initially attempt to connect to the server. If this fails, the commands are executed in stand-alone mode.	

<b>Connection Mode</b>	Description	
server	This specifies that IdcCommand will execute services only through the server.	
standalone	This specifies that IdcCommand will execute the services in a stand-alone session.	

## **COMMAND FILE SYNTAX**

#### **Precedence**

The command file syntax recognizes the *hda* syntax and uses precedence to resolve conflicts among the name/value pairs within the LocalData section. When normal name/value pairs are parsed, they are assumed to be within the @Properties LocalData tag. If the section contains *hda* tags, the normal name/value pairs take precedence over name/value pairs within the @Properties LocalData tag.

For example, if foo=x is in a normal name/value pair and foo=y is within the @Properties LocalData tag, the name/value pair foo=x takes precedence because it is outside the tag.

## **Special Characters**

These special tags are specific to the command file syntax:

<b>Special Characters</b>	Description
< <eod>&gt;</eod>	The end of data marker. The command file is made up of one or more sections separated with an end of data marker.

Special Characters	Description	
=	Within each section there are one or more name/value pairs. Each name/value pair resides on a separate line and the name is separated from the value with an equal character.	
#	The comment line marker. The pound character placed at the beginning of a line indicates that the line is a comment.	
\	The backslash is an escape character.	



**Note:** The command file recognizes *hda* syntax. Each section of the command file can contain an *hda* file. Consequently, the command file is able to understand the @ResultSet and @Properties LocalData tags.

## **Special Tags**

These special tags are specific to the command file syntax:

Special Tags	Description	
IdcService=	Each section of the command file must specify the name of the service it is calling. The IdcService tag is a name/value pair that specifies the command that is to be executed. The format IdcService=service_name is used.	

Special Tags	Description	
@Include	This tag allows the user to include content from another file at the spot where the @Include tag is placed. This tag can be used to include a complete hda file or to include shared name/value pairs. This inclusion takes the exact content of the specified file and places it in the location of the @Include tag. A file can be included as many times as desired and an included file may include other files. However, circular inclusions are not allowed. The format @Include filename (with space) is used.	



**Note:** Data from one section is not carried over to the next section. Each section must contain a complete set of data for the command.

# CREATING AND EXECUTING IDCCOMMAND PARAMETERS

The IdcCommand utility is run from the command line. In general, the user name and the command file must be specified. These options can be specified either on the command line or in an *intradoc.cfg* configuration file.

See the "Command Line Options" on 2-3 and "Configuration File Options" on 2-5 for an explanation of available commands.

Perform the following steps to run IdcCommand from the command line.

- 1. Create a new directory.
  - This directory will be used as the IdcCommand working directory. Use this directory for your configuration file and any command files.
- 2. Copy the *intradoc.cfg* configuration file from *stellent/bin/* into the newly created directory.



**Important:** Do not delete the WebBrowserPath or IntradocDir information.

In this example, two comment lines, the complete path to the assigned web browser, the complete path to the assigned HTML editor, and the complete path to the content server directory are defined.

#Configuration

#Fri Dec 31 23:59:59 CST 1999

WebBrowserPath=C:/Program Files/Plus!/Microsoft

Internet/Iexplore.exe

HTMLEditorPath=C:/Program Files/Windows

NT/Accessories/Wordpad.exe

IntradocDir=C:/stellent

3. Define the parameters listed in "Configuration File Options" on 2-5 in the copied *intradoc.cfg* configuration file located in the newly created directory, define the configuration file option parameters. See "Configuration File Options" on 2-5 for additional information.

In this example, IdcCommandFile references *newfile.hda*. The IdcService must be defined in that file.

IdcCommandFile=newfile.hda

IdcCommandUserName=sysadmin

IdcCommandLog=C:/stellent/newlog.txt

4. Create a command file in the newly created directory and add the desired command.

In this example, a command file named *newfile.hda*. is created and a user called "Jennifer" is defined within that file. Additional samples can be found in the descriptions of the various commands.

# Add a user

IdcService=ADD\_USER

dName=Jennifer

dUserAuthType=Local

dFullName=Jennifer Smith

```
dPassword=password
dEmail=email@email.com
```

5. Run IdcCommand. Follow the steps to run IdcCommand on NT or to run IdcCommand on Solaris provided on the following pages.

#### Run IdcCommand on NT

To run IdcCommand on NT, follow these steps:

6. From the command line, change to the IdcCommand working directory (created in step 1).

For example:

```
cd <working directory>
```

7. From the command line, change the *jview command* to define the correct path of the virtual machine.

```
For example:
```

```
jview /cp:a <install_dir>/shared/classes/server.zip
IdcCommand
```

#### **Run IdcCommand on Solaris**

To run IdcCommand on Solaris, follow these steps:

6. From the command line, change to the IdcCommand working directory (created in step 1).

For example:

```
cd <working directory>
```

7. From the command line, change the /bin/java command to define the correct path of the virtual machine.

For example:

bin/java -classpath ./classes:./classes/idcserver3.zip:<Oracle-JDBC-Driver-Path> IdcCommand -f command-file-name



**Note:** These commands are similar to the ones defined in the batch files located in the *stellent/bin* directory.



**Tech Tip:** The standard command line to run an IdcCommand batch is lengthy. To simply the process, included in the product executable are *wrappers* that can be used to execute IdcCommand with less command line entries. Compare the following two command lines:

#### Without wrapper:

C:\stellent\shared\os\win32\jdk1.3.1\_01\bin\java -cp
%stellent%\shared\classes\server.zip idccommand -u
sysadmin -f addusers.txt -l idclog.txt

#### With wrapper:

idccommand -u sysadmin -f addusers.txt -l idclog.txt

The command *wrappers* are available for both Unix and Windows. They make IdcCommand more accessible and easy to execute. See *Using the Stellent Launcher* (page 2-13) for additional information.

## **USING THE STELLENT LAUNCHER**

The Launcher is a native C++ application that allows a Java program to start as an NT service. This allows Stellent applications and servers to run from different Java classes, even if they are on the same machine. If you want to install a custom application and launch the program, you can use the Launcher.exe file to launch that program as a service.

The Launcher must reside in a directory with a valid intradoc.cfg configuration file and must have the same name as the Java class file to be launched (case sensitive).

For example:

<install dir>/bin/



**Tech Tip:** By using the Launcher.exe, changing the status.dat file, and altering the value of the JVM command line, you could theoretically run any Java program as an NT service. This is not recommended for normal use, but it does explain the many ways you could configure the Launcher.

## **User Interface**

The UI for the Launcher is exactly the same as the application it launches. For example, if the Launcher is renamed to IntradocApp, then to launch the Web Layout Editor, the following command line arguments are given:

IntradocApp WebLayout

This will launch the Web Layout Editor as a stand-alone application.

By default, the application will be launched without console output. However, when launching IdcServer, IdcAdmin, IdcCommandX, or the Installer, Java output is printed to the screen. In all other cases, the output is suppressed for a cleaner interface.

For some applications, such as the Batch Loader and the Repository Manager, it is desirable to view the Java output from the application. To force the Launcher to dump the Java output to the screen, use the "-console" flag in this manner:

```
IntradocApp RepMan -console
```

The output will now be written to the console from which the Repository Manager was launched.

If the Launcher is renamed IdcServer, BatchLoader, SystemProperties, or any other Java class that requires no additional parameters, it can be launched with a simple double-click. In other cases, a shortcut can be used to launch them by double-clicking.

## Configuring the Launcher

To use the Launcher, you must first rename the Launcher.exe file to an executable with the same name as the class file to be launched. Typical examples include IdcServer.exe or IntradocApp.exe.



**Note:** If you want to make a custom application, you should create the custom directory, and re-name the Launcher.exe to the service that is to be launched. A valid intradoc.cfg file needs to be in the same directory as the executable. The only required parameter is IntradocDir; however, other entries can be included to alter the way the Java application is launched.

## **Configuration File Example**

Configuration file example entries:

```
#intradoc.cfg values:
IntradocDir=c:/stellent/
#default additional values given below
CLASSPATH=$COMPUTEDCLASSPATH
```

```
JvmCommandLine=c:/winnt/jview.exe /cp:a "$CLASSPATH"
$STARTUPCLASS
JvmClasspathSeparator=;
```

If the values CLASSPATH, JvmCommandLine, or JvmClasspathSeparator are not specified in the file, the default values are used. The value for COMPUTEDCLASSPATH is:

```
/classes
$SHAREDDIR/classes
$SHAREDDIR/classes/server.zip
$SHAREDDIR/classes/idcrefinery.zip
$SHAREDDIR/os/win32/classes/dao.zip
$SHAREDDIR/classes/jspserver.jar
$SHAREDDIR/j2sdk/lib/tools.jar
```

This is sufficient to launch nearly all Stellent applications. Others, such as the Inbound Refinery, require additional classes in the classpath. This file can also be modified to enable Intradoc to be run with different Java virtual machines.



**Note:** The intradoc.cfg file is usually altered to include JDBC drivers for their particular database upon install. If you want to use alternate JDBC drivers, place them in the <install\_dir>/shared/classes directory, and alter the intradoc.cfg file accordingly.

For example, to run the Intradoc Server with IBM's virtual machine on NT, the command line would look like:

```
#customized for running IBM's VM
JvmCommandLine=jre -cp $CLASSPATH $STARTUPCLASS
```

The classpath is designed to look for class files in order of the listed entries. In other words, the Launcher will search the entire <install\_dir>/classes/ directory before it looks into the shared directory or server.zip file. This is desirable if the

users wish to overload Java classes without patching the zip file. Additionally, the

Launcher can be used to install, uninstall, and run Java applications as NT Services, provided that they follow the correct API for communicating back to the Launcher. See the source code for IdcServer.java or IdcAdmin.java for more details on how to make any Java application run as an NT service with the Launcher.

These are the common execution flags run on the command line:

Console Flags	Description		
-console	Forces the Launcher to print the Java output and error streams to the console.		
-install	Used to install the Java application referred to by the Launcher as an NT Service.		
-uninstall	Used to uninstall the Java application referred to by the Launcher as an NT Service.		
-remove	Same as -uninstall.		
-dependent <xxx></xxx>	Makes the NT service dependent on whether or not the service <xxx> is also running.</xxx>		
	Note: This command is useful when you want to make a dependent call for each service.		
	If you want to launch a database before starting the Content Server, you can specify the database start-up before the Content Server.		

Console Flags	Description	
-dependent <yyy> <zzz></zzz></yyy>	Must be used along with -install. It will install the service the credentials of user <yyy> with password <zzz>.</zzz></yyy>	
	<b>?</b>	<b>Note:</b> This command will check the user regardless of the credentials, but may not install the service. The credentials of the user need to extend to the service for the auto-start to run the service automatically.
	For certain services, such as the Inbound Refinery, the last flag is required so the service can run with higher permissions. The user name must be in the typical Microsoft format DOMAIN\User. Once users change passwords, the service will not be able to log in, and therefore will not run.	



**Tech Tip:** To customize the class path to alter the system path to load up Stellent .dll files, you can change the pathway to:

 $\label{lib-ison-index-search-vd-k-index-search-vd-index-search-vd-index-search-vd-index-search-vdk-index-s$ 

If you want to load up Stellent-specific custom .dlls, you should put them in the directory:

<install\_dir>/shared/os/win32/lib

## **CALLING SERVICES REMOTELY**

To use services remotely, you must have these two files on the remote machine:

- <instal\_dir>\bin\intradoc.cfg (same file as on the content server).
- <instal\_dir>\config\config.cfg

In addition, these configuration entries must be defined in the #Additional Variables section of the config.cfg file on the remote machine:

- IntradocServerPort=4444
- ❖ IntradocServerHostName=IP or DNS

# IDCCOMMANDX: ACTIVEX COMMAND UTILITY

### **INTRODUCTION**

IdcCommandX is an ActiveX control that allows a program to execute a service and retrieve file path information. IdcCommandX serves as a COM wrapper for the standard IdcCommand services used by content server.



Note: See "Chapter 1: IdcCommand" for additional information.

# **IdcCommandX Setup**



**Note:** A Visual Basic or Visual C++ development environment is required to use IdcCommandX.

Run the IdcCommandX ActiveX Command Utility setup executable located in the Extras/IDCCommandX sub-directory on the Stellent Content Server CD-ROM.

### Calling IcdCommandX

#### **Visual Basic**

Add IdcCommandX as a control to the Visual Basic project and code the following lines to create and initialize the control:

```
Set idcCmd=CreateObject("Idc.CommandX")
idcCmd.init("sysadmin", "c:\stellent\bin")
```

#### Visual C++

Add the IdcCommandX control to the project and call the desired IdcCommandX class.

### **Executing Services**

When executing services using the Stellent IdcCommandX ActiveX Command Utility keep these notes in mind:

- IdcCommandX must be initialized with a valid user and the intradoc.cfg directory. Outside of the init and connection managing methods, all methods use the serialized HDA format for communication.
- ❖ IdcCommandX attempts to establish a connection to a running server. If a connection is not made it fails.
- The returned serialized HDA format string contains information about the success or failure of the command. The StatusCode will be negative if a failure occurs, and StatusMessage will indicate the error.



**Tech Tip:** See *Using the Stellent Launcher* (page 2-13) for information on using the Launcher (a native C++ application that allows a Java program to start as an NT service).

# **M**ETHODS

#### init

Public Function init(UserName As String, StellentDir As String) As Boolean

#### **Description**

Initializes the system. This function initializes the system and must be called before using the IdcCommandX.

- ❖ The username and Stellent directory must be specified as parameters.
- ❖ Returns FALSE if the service fails to execute.

### **Required Parameters**

Name	Description
UserName	A valid user name must be used.
StellentDir	The working directory.  This is the directory containing the <i>intradoc.cfg</i> configuration file.
	If this parameter is not set, the current working directory is used.

#### executeCommand

Public Sub executeCommand(Data As String)

#### **Description**

Executes a service from the content server. This method automatically handles the connection to the server. It will not establish a connection if a connection has already been established with a connectToServer call. On completion of the command, the connection is closed.

- Returns a string representing a serialized HDA file that holds the original request as well as the results.
- \* Returns the serialized *hda* containing StatusCode and StatusMessage.
- ❖ Returns FALSE if there is a connection failure.

#### **Required Parameters**

Name	Description
Data	A string representing a serialized HDA file. For example, the IdcService command and any necessary service parameters.

### connectToServer

Public Function ConnectToServer() As Boolean

### **Description**

Allows the calling program to establish a connection to the server. The connection is held open until a command is executed. Once a command is executed the connection is closed. This method does not need to be called. It is provided only as a convenience for managing the state of the connection.

- \* Returns TRUE on successful execution.
- \* Returns FALSE if there is a connection failure.

#### **Required Parameters**

No additional data is required.

### closeServerConnection

Public Sub closeServerConnection()

#### **Description**

Closes the server connection. This method is provided as a convenience for managing the state of the connection. It does not need to be called after executing a command.

- ❖ Returns TRUE on successful execution.
- ❖ Returns FALSE if the service fails to execute.

#### **Required Parameters**

No additional data is required.

# computeWebFilePath

Public Function computeWebFilePath(Data As String) As String

#### **Description**

Computes the web file path. Computes the web file path from the serialized *hda* and returns the value as a string.

- \* Returns the serialized *hda* containing StatusCode and StatusMessage.
- Returns the same data that was passed in as the parameter is returned with an additional value WebFilePath set in the local data containing the web file path.

#### **Required Parameters**

Name	Description
Data	A string representing a serialized HDA file.

# computeNativeFilePath

Public Function computeNativeFilePath(Data As String) As String

#### **Description**

Computes the native file path. Computes the native file path from the serialized *hda* and returns the value as a string.

- \* Returns the serialized *hda* containing StatusCode and StatusMessage.
- \* Returns the same data that was passed in as the parameter is returned with an additional value NativeFilePath set in the local data containing the native file path.

#### **Required Parameters**

Name	Description
Data	A string representing a serialized HDA file.

Public Function computeURL(Data As String, IsAbsolute As Boolean) As String

#### **Description**

Computes the URL path. Computes the URL from the serialized *hda* and returns the value as a string.

- ❖ Returns serialized *hda* containing StatusCode and StatusMessage.
- Returns the same data that was passed in as the parameter is returned with an additional value URL set in the local data containing the URL path.

# USING SERVICES

# INTRODUCTION

### **CONCEPTUAL OVERVIEW**

A IdcCommand service is a defined function or procedure that can be performed in the system. These services can be used by any program or HTML page to request information from the server or perform a specified function.

These services are discrete and may require parameters. They are the only way a client can talk to the server or access the database.

A service is the mechanism for interacting with the server and consequently the database. They are the only way user initiated functionality is implemented. A service call can be performed from either the client or server side and consists of a single or multiple actions along with a template page.

#### **Service Request Process**

This is the process when a user requests information on a particular content item from within a browser.

- 1. The user clicks the INFO button from the search results page.
- 2. The browser makes a request to the server using IdcService DOC\_INFO.
- 3. The service performs an action consisting of a query to the database with dID as the parameter. This action is performed because the DOC\_INFO service requires that dID (the unique content item ID) be passed as a parameter.
- 4. One of these responses occurs:
  - ❖ If the browser request did not contain dID, the content server reports a system error.
  - ❖ If the query returns no results, the user is informed that the content item is not in the system.
  - ❖ If the service locates the content item, it performs several other actions, which could be queries, or code, and finally merges the information that it has calculated and/or queried with an HTML template page.

#### **Search Service Request Process**

This is the process when a user places a search request from within a browser:

- 1. The user completes the search form and clicks the SEARCH button.
- 2. The browser sends a request to the web server to perform a search. When using the search engine, the URL for the request contains the following syntax:

```
/intradoc-cgi/idc_cgi_isapi.dll?
idcService=GET SEARCH RESULTS
```

- 3. The web server recognizes this request as a Stellent Content Server function and sends the specific request to the Stellent Content Server for processing. In doing so, the Content Server sends a request to the search engine using a search engine API.
- 4. The search engine sends the search results back to the Stellent Content Server. In turn, the results are sent to the web server. The web server then delivers the result of the search service to your web browser.

## **SERVICE STRUCTURE**

The structure of a service-type resource is defined by a three column table. The table is delimited with a start tag <@table "tablename"@> and an end tag <@end@>. The first column contains the service's unique name. The second column describes the attributes of the service. The third column describes the actions that are performed by the service.

This example shows the HTML markup for a service entry in this table. This describes a service with *n* actions:

```
service name
service type
access level
```

The <br/>br> tag at the end of each action line is strictly for display purposes only and is optional. However, the 
must occur on the same line as the last action.

#### **Service Name**

This column contains information about the unique name of the service.

```
GET_DYNAMIC_PAGE
```

The reference to a service called in a URL is the service name. For example, this URL is calling the service named GET\_DYNAMIC\_PAGE:

```
/intradoc-
cgi/idc_cgi_isapi.dll?IdcService=GET_DYNAMIC_PAGE&
PageName=index
```

#### **Service Attributes**

A service is defined by a script, which defines its name, attributes and actions. The attributes determine the type of service, the access level or security, template page, sub-service (or null), subjects notified, and an error message.

Each service consists of this structure:

- Service type
- Security or access level
- Template page
- ❖ Sub-Service (or null)
- Subjects notified
- Service error message
- Associated actions

The format is stored in an HTML table and a service consists of a single row in the table. On startup the content server parses the table and loads the services into memory.

The script format is as follows:

```
type of action:function name:function
parameters:directives:error message
   type of action:function name:function
parameters:directives:error message
    ...
For example, the service for retrieving all documents
checked out for a given user role is:
CHECKIN_LIST
  DocService
      17
      CHECKIN_LIST
null
null<br>
Unable to retrieve check in list.
 1:QcheckedoutDocs:CHECKIN_LIST:0:null
     3:computeDocInfoInHtmlPage:CHECKIN_LIST:0:Unable to
compute user info.
```

#### **Service Type**

The service type defines the location of an HTM file containing the definition of service scripts. The type of service determines in part what actions can be called on it.

The types of services currently available are:

❖ Service—the default service.

- DocService—used for performing actions on documents. Examples are check in/out, document information, resubmit.
- ❖ FileService—used to retrieve files from the system.
- ❖ IndexerService—used to perform indexing related functions.
- MetaService—used to manage doc info fields.
- ❖ PageHandlerService—used by WebLayout Editor to edit pages.
- ❖ SearchService—used to perform search related functions.
- UserService—used to manage users (add/edit/delete).
- WorkflowService—used to manage workflows.
- ❖ WorkflowTemplateService—used to manage workflow templates.

#### **Security or Access Level**

Each service calls the global security check to determine if the logged on user has permission to execute the service. The global security check is only of relevance if the service requires global privilege. The check validates if the user needs to be part of the admin role or if he only needs a given privilege (less than ADMIN\_PRIVILEGE) on at least one group.

The bit flags combined together to create an access level:

- ❖ READ\_PRIVILEGE = 1
- $\clubsuit$  WRITE\_PRIVILEGE = 2
- **❖** DELETE\_PRIVILEGE = 4
- **❖** ADMIN\_PRIVILEGE = 8
- ❖ GLOBAL\_PRIVILEGE = 16

For example, to access the administration page, the service requires the user to be part of the admin role. Consequently, he needs to have global admin privilege and the service has the access level set to 24. If on the other hand, the user wishes to access the check in page, he needs write privilege on at least one group, and the access level of the security group is set to 18.

The GLOBAL\_PRIVILEGE flag is used to for these two purposes:

- ❖ If asking for admin privilege, ensures that the user has some type of admin or subadmin rights.
- ❖ Otherwise makes sure that the user has the requested access level to at least one security group in the content server. This is only relevant if the "guest" role has no rights at all and you want to force a user to login when they access such pages as the "Query Page" (note the Query Page uses the GLOBAL\_PRIVILEGE flag through the service GET\_DOC\_PAGE).

#### **Template page**

The template page is used to communicate back to the browser the successful request. Information that the service gathers is merged with the template page. Not all types of services require or even use a template page, e.g. the PageHandlerService. The template page name is mapped to an HTML file listed in the file ~/resources/templates/template.hda.

#### Sub-Service

The service may define a sub-service to execute, otherwise, the value null is used. For example, the service ADD\_WORKFLOWDOCUMENT executes the sub-service ADD\_WORKFLOWDOCUMENT\_SUB. This sub-service is a workflow related service that adds a revised content item to the workflow and consists of these actions:

- Queries whether the content item workflow is locked.
- ❖ Inserts the workflow content item information in the database.
- Retrieves the workflow content item name from the database.

- **\*** Evaluates the revision status of the content item.
- Creates a new revision.

#### **Subjects Notified**

If a service changes one or more subjects, it must notify others of these changes. The subjects notified string is a comma separated lists of changed subjects. For example, the ADD\_USER service adds a new user to the system, and subsequently informs the system that the "users" subject has changed. Possible subjects are: aliases, doctypes, docformats, documents, dynamicqueries, metadata, metaoptlists, pagelist, reports, templates, users, and workflows.

#### **Service Error Message**

The error message returned by the service, if no action has overridden it. Each action has an error message associated with it. If this message is not null, it becomes the error message for the remainder of the actions in the service. If it is null, the error message remains unchanged from the previous action. For example, the error message of CHECKIN\_LIST is "Unable to retrieve check in list" but on executing the second action it becomes "Unable to compute allowable user actions."

#### **Associated Actions**

Each service may contain one or more actions, which determines what happens on execution. Each service by default will inform its requestor of changes to subjects. Consequently, the PING\_SERVER service, which has no actions, is used by applets to detect changes in the state of the server.

#### **Action Type**

An action can be used to execute an SQL statement, perform a query, do code, cache the results of a query, and load an option list. The possible types of actions are:

- ❖ QUERY\_TYPE = 1
- **❖** EXECUTE\_TYPE = 2
- ♦ CODE\_TYPE = 3
- $\bullet$  OPTION\_TYPE = 4
- **❖** CACHE\_RESULT\_TYPE = 5

#### **Action Function**

- ❖ The function is restricted by the type of service and the type of action.
- ❖ For QUERY\_TYPE, the function must be a "select" query.
- ❖ For EXECUTE\_TYPE, the function specifies a query that performs an action on the database.
- ❖ For CODE\_TYPE, the function specifies a code module that is a part of the java class implementing the service.
- ❖ For OPTION\_TYPE, the function refers to an option list stored in the system.
- ❖ For CACHE\_RESULT\_TYPE, the function is as in QUERY\_TYPE, but here the results returned by the query are stored for later use.

The difference between QUERY\_TYPE and CACHE\_RESULT\_TYPE is that in the first case the query is immediately discarded as soon as another query is executed.

#### **Action Parameters**

The parameters are a comma-separated that are used by the functions. In the case of QUERY\_TYPE and CACHE\_RESULT\_TYPE, the first parameter will be the name the action assigns to the result set returned from the query.

For OPTION\_TYPE, the parameters are optional, but if they are given they are used as follows: the first parameter is the key under which the option list is loaded, the second parameter is the selected value for display on an HTML page.

#### **Action Control Mask**

The control mask is especially useful in controlling the results from queries to the database. Possible bit values and there meanings:

- ❖ CONTROL\_IGNORE\_ERROR = 1 Do not abort the service on error
- ❖ CONTROL\_MUST\_EXIST = 2 At least one record must be returned by the query.
- ❖ CONTROL\_BEGIN\_TRAN = 4 Starts a database transaction
- ❖ CONTROL\_COMMIT\_TRAN = 8 Concludes a database transaction
- ❖ CONTROL\_MUST\_NOT\_EXIST = 16 Query must not return any rows

CONTROL\_MUST\_EXIST and CONTROL\_MUST\_NOT\_EXIST are used only for QUERY\_TYPE and CACHE\_RESULT\_TYPE.

#### Action Error Message

Each action has an error message associated with it. If this message is not null, it becomes the error message for the remainder of the actions in the service. If it is null, the error message remains unchanged from the previous action. For example, the error message of CHECKIN\_LIST is "Unable to retrieve check in list" but on executing the second action it becomes "Unable to compute allowable user actions."

# **EXAMPLE SERVICE: DOC\_INFO**

This section describes the DOC\_INFO service and provides code samples from the std\_services HTM file and the doc\_info HTM template file.

These are the defined attributes of the DOC\_INFO service.

- Service Type: DocService—This service is providing information about a content item.
- ❖ Access Level: 1—The user requesting the service must have read privilege on the content item.
- ❖ Template Page: DOC\_INFO—This service uses the DOC\_INFO template (doc\_info.htm file).
- ❖ Sub Service: null—This service does not define a sub-service to execute.
- ❖ Subjects Notified: null—No subjects are affected by this service.
- **Error Message: Unable to retrieve information about the revision.**

#### **Service Actions**

The DOC\_INFO service consists of these actions:

Action 1— Cached query action that retrieves information from the database using a query. This action retrieves content item information. The result of this query is assigned to the parameter DOC\_INFO and stored for later use. The control mask setting specifies that the query must return a record or the action fails with the given error message. The action throws a data exception if the content item no longer exists and returns this error message: *This content item no longer exists*.

Action 2— Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action retrieves the data assigned to the parameter DOC\_INFO and maps the result set values for *dStatus* and *dDocTitle*.

Action 3—Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action retrieves the data assigned to the parameter DOC\_INFO and evaluates the assigned security level to verify that the user is authorized to perform this action. If the user fails the security check this error message is returned: *Unable to retrieve information for* "{dDocName}".

Action 4—Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action retrieves the file formats for the content item. The action passes *QdocFormats* as a parameter (defined in <*install\_dir*>/config/resources/query.htm). The file formats are passed to the *Formats*: entry of the DOC\_INFO template.

Action 5—Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action resolves the URL of the content item. The URL is passed to the *Web Location:* entry of the DOC\_INFO template.

Action 6—Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action resolves the email address of the content item author and the user who has checked out the content item. The action passes *dDocAuthor* and *AuthorAddress* as parameters.

Action 7—Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action resolves the email address of the content item author and the user who has checked out the content item. The action passes *dCheckoutUser* and *CheckoutUserAddress* as parameters.

Action 8—Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action evaluates whether the content item is part of a workflow. The action passes WF\_INFO as a parameter. The DOC\_INFO template is referenced and if WF\_INFO exists then workflow information is included in the DOC\_INFO template.

Action 9—Code action specifying a code module that is a part of the Java class implementing the service. This action evaluates whether the current user has subscribed to the content item and modifies the DOC\_INFO page. 4If the current user is subscribed, an **Unsubscribe** button is displayed. If the user is not subscribed, a **Subscribe** button is displayed. The action passes *QisSubscribed* as a parameter (defined in <*install\_dir*>/config/resources/query.htm).

Action 10—Cached query action that retrieves information from the database using a query. This action retrieves revision history information. The result of this query is assigned to the parameter REVISION\_HISTORY. The DOC\_INFO template uses REVISION\_HISTORY in a loop to present information about each revision in the DOC\_INFO page. If the action fails, the service returns this error message: *Unable to retrieve revision history for "{dDocName}"*.

#### **TUTORIAL: CREATING A CUSTOM SERVICE**

#### **Overview**

These are the steps required to create a new service:

- 1. Define a service in an HTM file. The file must include a table that is identical in structure to the StandardServices table.
- 2. Load your service by defining it in a ResourceDefinition ResultSet.
- 3. Merge the table defining your service with the StandardServices table.

#### **Steps**

Follow these steps the create a custom service:

- Make a copy of the file <home>/shared/config/ resources/std\_services.htm and place it into your component's resources/ directory.
- 2. Edit the table definition column entries for Name, Attributes, and Actions.

#### **Overview**

In this section, you will create a new query to read from the subscriptions table, a new service to call the query, and a new template page to display the results. A button will be added to the content information page to call the new service. The button on the Information page will be displayed next to the Subscribe/Unsubscribe button.

We will use the Component Wizard to create a new project. We will then create a new template page that will display the subscription information. Next, we will create the query to retrieve subscriptions from the database and then we will create the service, which will call that query. Finally, we will update a resource to add our new button to the doc info page.

#### **Steps**

Follow these step to create the new service component:

- 1. Open the Component Wizard and create a new component named SubscribedUsers.
- 2. Add a new Template selecting the error page as the base to begin from. Enter these parameters as shown:

File Name: SubscribedUsers\_List.htm

## **CONCEPTUAL OVERVIEW**

These commands can be called from the IdcCommand and IdcCommandX interface. Each scripted service defined in the content server can be used as a command. The service can have required and/or optional parameters.

- ❖ Execute a PING\_SERVER request before calling other services to ensure that there is a connection to the content server and that you are logged in as a user authorized to execute commands (see page 5-298).
- ❖ All commands must have the IdcService parameter set to the service that is to be executed.

#### **Admin Server Related Services**

These services are used by the Admin Server to request information (see Available Services starting on page 5-8 for additional information on each of these services):

Service	Description
CONFIG_INFO	This service retrieves configuration information for the currently active component.
DOWNLOAD_COMPONENT	This service executes a download of the existing component.
GET_SERVER_OUTPUT	This service loads the server output for display.
UPLOAD_NEW_COMPONENT	This service unpackages the files according to the manifest and uploads the new component for installation.

## **Content Publisher Related Services**

These services are used by Content Publisher (see Available Services starting on page 5-8 for additional information on each of these services):

Service	Description
DOC_INFO_LATESTRELEASE	This service retrieves the latest revision.
GET_DOC_CONFIG_INFO	This service retrieves configuration information.
GET_DOCUMENT_PROBLEMRE PORTS	This service provides a content item problem report.

## **Customization Related Services**

UPDATE_META_TABLE	This service updates the DocMeta table with the newly added or deleted custom metadata columns.
UPDATE_OPTION_LIST	This service adds or updates the specified option list.

## **Provider Related Services**

A provider is an Application Programming Interface (API) that establishes a connection to outside entities such as databases, LDAP servers, server sockets, or other Content Server instances.

DELETE_PROVIDER	This service deletes the specified provider.
ENABLE_DISABLE_PROVIDER	This service reverses the provider enable state. If the provider is enabled, the service disables the provider. If the provider is disabled, the service enables the provider.
GET_ADD_EDIT_PROVIDER_ FORM	This form return service creates a provider form if one does not exist or updates an existing provider form.
GET_ALL_PROVIDERS	This service returns the provider list containing all providers.
GET_PROVIDER_INFO	This service retrieves provider information.
NOTIFY_CHANGE	This service notifies the provider of changes to the content item.
REQUEST_SECURITYINFO	This service retrieves security information.
TEST_PROVIDER	This service tests the defined provider

## **AVAILABLE SERVICES**

#### ADD\_ALIAS

#### **Description**

This service adds alias information.

- Given an alias name and a defined user, the service adds alias information.
- ❖ The most likely errors are mismatched parameters or when a user or alias already exists in the system. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user in these situations.
- ❖ If you add an alias using the applet, you must add at least one user.

  However, you do not need to add a user using IdcCommandX. To add users using IdcCommandX, the optional parameter AliasUsersString must be included.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dAlias	The alias name.
dAliasDescription	The alias description.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_ALIAS.

## **Optional Parameters**

This optional parameter may be specified:

Parameter	Description
AliasUsersString	The alias user or users. To add multiple users, use the \n escape sequence between each user name.  For example: AliasUsersString=sysadmin\nuser1

## **Example**

To create an alias and add a user the required parameters will be:

#### ADD\_ARCHIVE

#### **Description**

This service adds an archive to the collection.

- Given an archive name and a defined instance menu label, the service adds an archive to the collection.
- ❖ The IDC\_Name is normally the name of the collection. If you are using the default collection then this is the name of the content server instance.
- The most likely errors are mismatched parameters or when an archive name is not unique. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to add archive "{aArchiveName}" to the collection "{InstanceMenuLabel}"*.



**Caution:** Using duplicate IDC\_Name collection names will cause data corruption. The Archiver cannot be used to move or copy data between two instances that share the same IDC\_Name. To do so will corrupt the data on the target system.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
aArchiveDescription	The menu label for the server instance (used on the interface). For example, Master_on_server01.
aArchiveName	The archive name.
IDC_Name	The name of the content server instance.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_ARCHIVE.

## **Example**

To add an archive to a master content server, the required parameters will be:

IdcService=ADD\_ARCHIVE
IDC\_Name=Master\_on\_server01

## ADD\_COLLECTION

#### **Description**

This service adds a collection.

- ❖ Given a defined instance menu label, the service adds a collection.
- ❖ The IDC\_Name is normally the name of the collection. If you are using the default collection then this is the name of the content server instance.
- ❖ The most likely error is an instance menu label that is not unique. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to add collection* "{InstanceMenuLabel}".
- ❖ If you are adding a new collection, you should add the new name to that collection using the IDC\_Name parameter; otherwise the error message "the collection already exists" will be returned.



**Caution:** Using duplicate IDC\_Name collection names will cause data corruption. The Archiver cannot be used to move or copy data between two instances that share the same IDC\_Name. To do so will corrupt the data on the target system.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
aCollectionLocation	The absolute path to the collection location. Use the forward slash as the file separator.
aVaultDir	The absolute path to the vault. Use the forward slash as the file separator.

Parameter	Description
aWeblayoutDir	The absolute path to the weblayout directory. Use the forward slash as the file separator.
IDC_Name	The name of the content server instance.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_COLLECTION.

## **Example**

- The most likely error is an account name that is not unique. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user.

dDocAccount	The security account for the content item.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_DOC_ACCOUNT.

#### **Example**

IdcService=ADD\_DOC\_COLLECTION
dDocAccount=newaccount

## ADD\_DOCEXTENSION

#### **Description**

This service adds a file extension.

- ❖ Given a defined file extension, the service adds the extension to an existing file.
- ❖ The most likely error is when a matching file with that extension already exists in the system. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dExtension	The file extension such as HCSF, DOC, TXT.
dFormat	The formatting process used to create the web viewable version of the content. For example, application/hcsf or application/doc.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_DOCEXTENSION.

#### **Example**

IdcService=ADD\_DOCEXTENSION
dExtension=doc
dFormat=application/doc

## ADD\_DOCFORMAT

#### **Description**

This service adds a new file format.

- ❖ Given a defined file format name, the service adds a new file format to the system.
- ❖ The most likely error is when the file format already exists in the system. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user.

## **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dConversion	The conversion algorithm is determined by the parameter dConversion.
	If the conversion type is not "PASSTHRU" or "NOCONVERSION" (default value) and the content is not web viewable or has a publish state, the content gets added to the queue to get converted. Otherwise, the server looks for the web-viewable (if applicable) and the vault file and updates the processing state to say that the file has already been converted. If the file mime-type is Application/FDF, the server will set the conversion to "EXCHANGE-FDF".
dDescription	The provided description.
dFormat	The formatting process used to create the web viewable version of the content. For example, application/hcsf or application/doc.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_DOCFORMAT.

## **Example**

dConversion=PASSTHRU

## ADD\_DOCTYPE

#### **Description**

This service adds a new file type.

- Given a file format type, the service adds a new file type to the system.
- ❖ The most likely error is when the content item format type name is not unique. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dDescription	The provided description.
dDocType	The content item type.
dGif	The name of the GIF image with file extension.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_DOCTYPE.

## **Example**

IdcService=ADD\_DOCTYPE
dDocType=MYTEST
dDescription=My Description.
dGif=adeng.gif

## ADD\_EDIT\_PROVIDER

### **Description**

This service adds a new provider.

- ❖ Given a credit provider name, the service adds a new provider to the system.
- The most likely error is when the provider name is not unique. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to add or edit provider "{pName}*".

## **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_EDIT_PROVIDER.
pDescription	The provided description for the provider.
pName	The provider name.
ProviderClass	The provider class.

Parameter	Description
рТуре	The provider type:
	❖ Database—An information repository server that provides an API for connecting and communicating with it. This retrieves information and enables information to be changed in the database. Examples of this type are system databases and LDAP.
	<ul> <li>Incoming—A connection initiated from an outside entity like a browser or client application.</li> <li>The server listens and is aware of incoming connections</li> </ul>
	Outgoing—A connection initiated to an outside entity. You can use this type to communicate between Content Server instances.

**Important:** The value dPrivilege defines the privilege setting. If this value is set to 0 only admin has RWDA privilege on the group, no other roles will be able to access the group. If the value is set to 15 then all the roles get RWDA privilege on the group. For more information about numbering of privilege, please refer to the *Content Server Security Guide*.

## **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dDescription	The provided description.
dGroupName	The defined group name.
dPrivilege	The privilege setting.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_GROUP.

### **Example**

dGroupName=NEW\_GROUP
dPrivilege=15

### ADD\_METADEF

#### **Description**

This service adds a new meta field.

- ❖ The service adds a new meta definition field to the system.
- ❖ For example, the format for *dOptionListType* may look like this:

- ❖ The most likely errors are mismatched parameters, when the system is unable to add a problem report to the content item, or when the content item no longer exists in the system. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user in these situations.



**Note:** Refer to the Content Publisher documentation for additional information on Staging Workflow

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dDocName	The content item identifier (Content ID).
dID	The generated content item revision ID.
dPrCaption	The caption for the problem report.
dPrSeverity	The problem report severity level such as CRITICAL, MODERATE, MINOR. This option has no bearing on how a problem report is handled within the workflow process.
dPrState	The problem report state such as OPEN, CLOSED, FIXED.

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_PROBLEMREPORT.



**Note:** Do not confuse the Content ID (dDocName) with the internal content item revision identifier (dID). The *dID* is a generated reference to a specific rendition of a content item.

- ❖ The most likely error is when the role name is not unique. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user.



**Important:** The value dPrivilege defines the privilege setting. If this value is set to 0 only admin has RWDA privilege on the group, no other roles will be able to access the group. If the value is set to 15 then all the roles get RWDA privilege on the group. For more information about numbering of privilege, please refer to the *Content Server Security Guide*.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dPrivilage	The privilage setting.
dRoleName	The unique role name.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_ROLE.

#### **Example**

## ADD\_USER

### **Description**

This service adds a new user to the system.

- ❖ Given a user name, the service determines if the user is in the system. If the user does not exist, the service will add the user.
- ❖ The most likely error is when the user name is not unique. If this service is unable to execute, an error message is displayed to the user.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dName	The unique name.
dUserAuthType	The user authoization type. This value must be set to either LOCAL or GLOBAL.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_USER.

### **Optional Parameters**

These optional parameters may be specified:

Parameter	Description
dEmail	The email address for the user.
dFullName	The full name of the user.
dPassword	The password for the user.

### **Optional Attribute Information**

A result set containing the user's attribute information and referencing the roles the user belongs to and the accounts the user has access to. Attribute information consists of a list of three comma-separated strings. The first string indicates the type of attribute, the second the name of the attribute, and the third is the access number for *accounts* or default entry for *role*.



**Important:** The user attribute information is not pre-defined. The user by default will belong to no roles or accounts, and will become a guest in the system.

Attribute Information	Description
Access Number	The access number determines the level of access or privileges assigned to the user
Attribute Name	The attribute name is the name of the <i>role</i> or <i>account</i> to be assigned. For example, admin, contributor, or editor may be assigned.
Attribute Type	The attribute types consists of <i>role</i> or <i>account</i>

#### Access Number

These access numbers can be assigned to the user.

Access Level Flags	Description
1	Read only.
3	Read and write.
7	Read, write, and delete.
15	Administrative privileges.

#### Attribute Name

A user can belong to multiple roles and accounts, there may be multiple role and account information strings separated by commas in the attribute information column.

❖ If the user is to have the admin role, define the user attribute information as follows:

When defining a role, the first string specifies that this is a role attribute, the second string is the name of the role, and the third is the default entry of 15.

• For an attribute role, the information is in the form:

❖ For an attribute account where the access level determines the users rights to the named account, the information is in the form:

These parameters must be specified:

dWfTemplateName	The workflow template name.
IdcService	Must be set to ADD_WF_TEMPLATE.

### **Example**

#### ADD WORKFLOW

#### **Description**

This workflow related service adds a new workflow.

- Given a unique workflow name, the service adds a new workflow to the system.
- This service is executed by the Workflow Admin applet. Workflows and sub-workflows can be added, edited, enabled, disabled, and deleted from the Workflow Admin administration applet.
- ❖ Workflow Types---From a workflow administrator's point of view, there are three types of workflows:
  - A Basic workflow defines the review process for specific content items, and must be initiated manually.
  - In a Criteria workflow, a file enters the workflow automatically upon checkin when its metadata matches predefined criteria.
  - A sub-workflow is a workflow that does not have an initial contribution step. A file can enter a sub-workflow only through a jump from a Criteria workflow.
- ❖ Each workflow can include multiple review and notification steps, and multiple reviewers can be assigned to approve or reject the file at each step. For each step in a workflow, a set of users and a step type must be defined. The users defined for a step can perform only the tasks allowed for that step type.
- ❖ The most likely error is when the workflow name is not unique. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user.



**Note:** If the security group of a checked in file does not match the security group of the workflow, the file will not enter the workflow.

## **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description

- Any Idoc script in the auto prefix is evaulated after the new revision class ID is generated and before metadata validation. The evaluated prefix is used to build the content name.

- Any IdocScript in the auto prefix is evaulated after the new revision class ID is generated and before metadata validation. The evaluated prefix is used to build the content name.
- ❖ All prior metadata values are inherited from the previous revision even if it is not specified in the service call.
- ❖ If metafile generation is enabled (by setting the AllowPrimaryMetaFile and/or AllowAlternateMetaFile environment variables) and the metafile generation flags (createPrimaryMetaFile and createAlternateMetaFile) are true, a real file cannot be associated with the current content item. - ❖ Determines if the content item is new or already exists in the system by querying the database using the content ID (dDocName) as the key..
- ❖ If the content item exists in the system, the publish state (dPublishState) must be empty.
- ❖ If a revision label (dRevLabel) is specified, this service will check if the content revision exists in the system; an exception is thrown if it exists.
- \* This service will dispatch this request to:
  - CHECKIN NEW SUB If the content item does not exist in the server.
  - CHECKIN\_SEL\_SUB If the content item exists on the system and no valid revision was specified and the content item is checked out.
  - WORKFLOW\_CHECKIN\_SUB If the content item exists and is part of a workflow.
- ❖ The most likely errors are mismatched parameters or when the content item was not successfully checked in. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: Content item "{dDocName}" was not successfully checked in.

The CHECKIN\_UNIVERSAL service is a content server controlled check in. The check in will fall into either a new, selected, or workflow check in process and follow the same logic as a check in through the browser or Repository Manager application. If the content item to be checked in already exists in the system, the content item must be checked out for the check in to succeed.

These are essentially the same sub-services used during a content server controlled check in. However, these sub-services are not called during a

BatchLoad or Archive import. This service will check security to determine if the user has sufficient privilege to perform a check in on the content item and if the content item (if it exists) has been checked out. Also, it will determine if the content item matches a workflow criteria or belongs to an active basic workflow.

If the content item is not found the content item is checked in using the CHECKIN\_NEW\_SUB sub-service. This sub-service validates the check in data and determines if this content item belongs to a criteria workflow. If the content item already exists in the system and the content item does not belong to a workflow, the CHECKIN\_SEL\_SUB is used. Otherwise the content item exists and belongs to a workflow and the WORKFLOW\_CHECKIN\_SUB is used.



**Note:** All paths use the forward slash ("/") as the file separator. This is because the backslash ("\") is an escape character. For example, primaryFile=d:/temp/myfile.txt should point to the primary file to check in.

- The service will fail if the content item does not exist in the system, if the content item is already checked out, or if the user does not have sufficient privilege to checkout the content item.
- This service is used from a browser and returns a response page (compare CHECKOUT\_BY\_NAME).
- ❖ The most likely error is when the content no longer exists in the system or when the system is unable to retrieve revision information. If this service is unable to execute, an error message is displayed to the user.
- ❖ This service executes the sub-service CHECKOUT\_SUB. This sub-service checks out a content item revision.



**Note:** This service only marks the content item as locked. It does not perform a download.

### **CONTROL SEARCH INDEX**

### **Description**

This service is used to update or rebuild the search index.

- Updates or rebuilds are performed automatically in a background thread.
- Automatic Update Cycle—Incrementally updates the index database. This is usually not necessary because the Index is automatically updated approximately every five minutes by the server.
- Collection Rebuild Cycle—The search index is entirely rebuilt, and the old index collection is replaced with a new index collection once the rebuild has successfully completed.



**Important:** Rebuilding the Search Index is necessary only when you change or add Information Fields. Depending on the quantity and size of your files, this process may take a couple of days. If rebuilding is necessary, rebuild at times of non-peak system usage. Rebuilding is system-intensive.

- This service is called when changes are made to the Automatic Update Cycle and Collection Rebuild Cycle options provided on the Repository Manager: Indexer Tab.
- ❖ To configure the automatic update cycle or collection rebuild cycle using the Repository Manager, click **Configure** in the Automatic Update Cycle area or Collection Rebuild Cycle area of the Indexer tab. This enables you to configure how the search index automatically indexes new files and revision or how a rebuild of the entire collection indexes new files and revisions.
- ❖ The options defined on the Configure Automatic Update Cycle or Configure Collection Rebuild Cycle screen map to these parameters:
  - Content Items Per Indexer Batch (MaxCollectionSize)

- Content Items Per Checkpoint (IndexerCheckpointCount)
- Indexer Debug Level (SearchDebugLevel)
- Indexer Auto Updates (sEnableAutoUpdate)
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to execute indexing control.*



**Tech Tip:** This service can be executed with *getStatus* set to TRUE, to return the defined settings and status information (see example below).

A user can belong to multiple roles and accounts, there may be multiple role and account information strings separated by commas in the attribute information column.

If the user is to have the admin role, define the user attribute information as follows:

#### **Description**

This service executes a secure page request.

- This service requires the name of the page to retrieve and the action to execute.
- ❖ The most likely error is when the referenced HTM page is not found. If this service is unable to execute, an error message is displayed to the user.
- ❖ This service executes the sub-service LOAD\_DOC\_ENVIRONMENT. This sub-service loads the template page configuration information for the content item environment.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
Action	The action to execute. This is usually GetTemplatePage.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_SECURE_PAGE.
Page	The HTML page requested.

#### **Example**

To get the content management page the parameters will be:

IdcService=GET\_SECURE\_PAGE
Page=DOC\_MANAGEMENT\_LINKS
Action=GetTemplatePage

## **GET\_SELF\_REGISTER\_PAGE**

### **Description**

This service retrieves the self registration page.

- **\$** Used for editing personalization.
- ❖ The service retrieves the self registration page and loads the user meta data information for user self registration.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to GET_SELF_REGISTER_PAGE.

### **Example**

IdcService=GET\_SELF\_REGISTER\_PAGE

### GET\_SERVER\_OUTPUT

#### **Description**

This Admin Server related service retrieves the server output.

- Used to load the server output for display.
- ❖ No additional parameters are required when executing this service through IdcCommand. If you run the service from the browser environment, you must include the *IDC\_Name* parameter.
- ❖ The IDC\_Name is normally the name of the collection. If you are using the default collection then this is the name of the content server instance.
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: Unable to output from server.



**Caution:** Using duplicate IDC\_Name collection names will cause data corruption. The Archiver cannot be used to move or copy data between two instances that share the same IDC\_Name. To do so will corrupt the data on the target system.

## **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to GET_SERVER_OUTPUT.

#### **Additional Parameters**

This parameters may be required:

Parameter	Description
IDC_Name	Required if you run the service from the browser environment. The name of the content server instance.

## **Example**

## **GET\_TABLE**

#### **Description**

This service exports the specified table in the content server database.

- ❖ Exports the specified table by creating a result set and adding it to the serialized *hda*. If the table is not found the service will fail. It is up to the calling program receiving the serialized *hda* to store this result set for later usage.
- The most likely error is a table name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, an error message is displayed to the user.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to GET_TABLE.
tableName	The name of table to export.

## **GET\_UPDATE\_FORM**

#### **Description**

This form return related service builds the update form.

- ❖ The most likely error is naming a content item that is no longer in the system. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: Unable to build update form for "{dDocName}".

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dID	The generated content item revision ID.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_UPDATE_FORM.

### **Example**

IdcService=GET\_UPDATE\_FORM
dID=59

## **GET\_UPDATE\_PROBLEMREPORT\_FORM**

### **Description**

This workflow related service retrieves the problem report update form.

- ❖ Given a problem report ID, the service retrieves the problem report update form from the database.
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve problem report update form.*

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dPrID	The problem report ID.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_UPDATE_PROBLEMREPORT_FORM.

### **Example**

IdcService=GET\_UPDATE\_PROBLEMREPORT\_FORM

## **GET\_USER\_INFO**

### **Description**

This service retrieves the user list.

- ❖ Given a defined user, the service retrieves the user list.
- ❖ If this service is run from the browser environment, the content server returns the user information for the currently logged in user.
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve user list*.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dUser	The defined user.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_USER_INFO.

## **Example**

IdcService=GET\_USER\_INFO
dUser=sysadmin

## **GET\_USERS**

### **Description**

This service retrieves a list of all users.

- Returns a list of all users registered in the system with their primary attributes: username, full name, password, email address, directory, old style role (when only one role was given each user), type, and password encoding.
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve user list*.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to GET_USERS.

### **Example**

IdcService=GET\_USERS

# **GET\_WF\_TEMPLATE**

#### **Description**

This workflow related service retrieves workflow template information.

- Given a workflow template name, this service returns the template description.
- ❖ The most likely error is a workflow template name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: Unable to retrieve data for template "{dWfTemplateName}".
- **❖** Compare GET\_WF\_TEMPLATES.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dWfTemplateName	The workflow template name.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_WF_TEMPLATE.

### **Example**

IdcService=GET\_WF\_TEMPLATE
dWfTemplateName=servicestemplate

# **GET\_WF\_TEMPLATES**

### **Description**

This workflow related service returns all workflow template names and their descriptions.

- ❖ The most likely error is a workflow name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve workflow templates*.
- ❖ Compare GET\_WF\_TEMPLATE.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to GET_WF_TEMPLATES.

# **GET\_WORKFLOW**

### **Description**

This workflow related service retrieves workflow information.

- ❖ Given a workflow name, the service retrieves workflow information.
- ❖ The most likely error is a workflow name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve information for the workflow "{dWfName}"*.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description	
dWfName	The workflow name.	
IdcService	Must be set to GET_WORKFLOW.	

# **Example**

IdcService=GET\_WORKFLOW
dWfName=D20

# **GET\_WORKFLOW\_INFO**

#### **Description**

This workflow related service retrieves the Workflow Step information for content (usually in active workflow).

- ❖ Given a content item ID and a workflow contribution stage, the service retrieves content item workflow information.
- This service is executed in a browser interface by selecting Active Workflows from PNE links, clicking on the workflow name, and then clicking the link for step name.
- ❖ The dWfStepID parameter is required for this service. The content server automatically assigns dWfStepID for that contribution stage.
- The most likely error is a content item or workflow name that does not exist. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user in these situations.

# **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dID	The generated content item revision ID.
dWfStepID	The workflow contribution stage ID. This autogenerated value can be retrieved from the database table.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_WORKFLOW_INFO.

# **Example**

IdcService=GET\_WORKFLOW\_INFO

dWfStepID=19

# **GET\_WORKFLOWDOCREVISIONS**

#### **Description**

This workflow related service retrieves the content item revision list for a workflow.

- Given a workflow name, the service retrieves the content item list of revisions for that workflow.
- This service is run in the browser environment by selecting Active Workflows in PNE links and clicking on the workflow name.
- ❖ The most likely error is a workflow name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve content item list for workflow "{dWfName}*".

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dWfName	The workflow name.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_WORKFLOWDOCREVISIONS.

#### **Example**

IdcService=GET\_WORKFLOW
dWfName=D20

# **GET\_WORKFLOWDOCUMENTS**

#### **Description**

This workflow related service retrieves the content item list for a workflow.

- Given a workflow name, the service retrieves the content item list for that workflow. The service provides a list of all content items in workflows and is updated by the system server to keep track of the status of content items (state and step) that are in workflows.
- ❖ The most likely error is a workflow name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve content item list for workflow "{dWfName}*".

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dWfName	The workflow name.
IdcService	Must be set to GET_WORKFLOWDOCUMENTS.

#### **Example**

IdcService=GET\_WORKFLOWDOCUMENTS

dWfName=c2

# **GET\_WORKFLOWS**

### **Description**

This workflow related service retrieves a list of all workflows.

- Retrieves a list of all workflows including their description, security group, status, and type.
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve workflow list*.

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to GET_WORKFLOWS.

# **GET\_XML\_HIGHLIGHT\_INFO**

### **Description**

This service retrieves XML highlight information.

- This service is called if a user is doing a full-text search for a PDF document in a browser environment. When the user selects the link for the PDF on the result page and views the highlighted word on the PDF.
- The most likely error is a content item name that does not exist. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user in these situations.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description	
dDocName	The content item identifier (Content ID).	
HighlightType	The highlight type:	
	❖ For PDF, use PdfHighlight.	
	For HTML, use HtmlHighlight.	
IdcService	Must be set to GET_XML_HIGHLIGHT_INFO.	
QueryText	The user supplied text submitted for the content item query.	
SortField	The name of the metadata field to sort on.	
	❖ Examples: dInDate, dOutDate, alternateFile.	
	Defaults to DOCID.	
SortOrder	The sort order. Allowed values are ASC (ascending) and DES (descending).	



**Note:** Do not confuse the Content ID (dDocName) with the internal content item revision identifier (dID). The *dID* is a generated reference to a specific rendition of a content item.

#### IMPORT ARCHIVE

#### **Description**

This service imports a given archive.

- Given a collection and an archive in the collection, this service will attempt to import the archive. The import will read in the archive's definition file and will follow the import rules specified. For this service to successfully execute, the IdcCommand script must specify if documents, users and/or document configuration information is to be imported.
- ❖ The server executes this service asynchronously. This means that the server needs to be running for the services to be even executed and that IdcCommand will exit announcing success, when actually all it has done is told the server to perform the action.
- ❖ The server can only export or import archives one at a time. A batch file that has multiple exports and imports will declare success on the first and failure on all subsequent commands until it has finished the first. This means that a batch file should have only one export or import in it and some external process will need to determine that the action has completed before issuing another export/import command.
- The most likely error is a archive name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to import archive "{aArchiveName}*".
- ❖ The IDC\_Name is normally the name of the collection. If you are using the default collection then this is the name of the content server instance.



**Caution:** Using duplicate IDC\_Name collection names will cause data corruption. The Archiver cannot be used to move or copy data between two instances that share the same IDC\_Name. To do so will corrupt the data on the target system.

# **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
aArchiveName	The archive name.
IDC_Name	The collection name or content server instance the collection belongs to.
IdcService	Must be set to IMPORT_ARCHIVE.



**Note:** One of the listed *Additional Parameters* must be set for this service to successfully execute.

#### **Additional Parameters**

- ❖ The most likely error is a content item name that does not exist. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to import content item "{dDocName}*".



**Caution:** Using duplicate IDC\_Name collection names will cause data corruption. The Archiver cannot be used to move or copy data between two instances that share the same IDC\_Name. To do so will corrupt the data on the target system.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
aArchiveName	The archive name.
dDocName	The content item identifier (Content ID).
IDC_Name	The name of the content server instance.
IdcService	Must be set to IMPORT_DOCUMENT.

# LOAD\_GLOBALINCLUDES

This service returns the portal page content.

- ❖ Used during the page assembly process for dynamic pages.
- ❖ Using Web Layout Editor applet, select Options—Update Portal. The content shown on that screen is the content that is returned from content server if you run this service.
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to load global includes*.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to LOAD_GLOBALINCLUDES.

### **Example**

IdcService=LOAD\_GLOBALINCLUDES

### LOAD\_RESOURCE\_FILE

#### **Description**

This service returns the specified resource file.

- ❖ The LOAD\_RESOURCE\_FILE command computes the dID for the revision, and then determines the filename of a particular rendition of the revision with the computed dID. A specified dID or a dDocName along with a RevisionSelectionMethod parameter can be used.
- Given a dID or a dDocName along with a RevisionSelectionMethod parameter, the service determines the filename of a particular rendition of the revision and returns that file to the client
- The most likely errors are some form of mismatched parameters or a request for a revision or rendition that does not exist. The service throws reasonable exceptions for display to the user in these situations.



**Note:** It is recommended that *dDocName* be present in all requests for content items where the requester knows the *dDocName*. Error messages in the content server assume that it is present, as do other features such as forms.

#### **Required Parameters**



**Important:** Either the content item revision ID (*dID*) must be specified or a content item name (*dDocName*) along with a *RevisionSelectionMethod* parameter must be defined.

Parameter	Description

	❖ If the value is <i>Alternate</i> , the alternate rendition of the selected revision is returned.

Parameter	Description
RevisionSelectionMet hod	The revision selection method.  If present, dDocName must be present. The value of this variable is the method used to compute a dID from the specified dDocName. Its value may be Specific, Latest, or LatestReleased.
	❖ If the value is <i>Specific</i> , the dDocName is ignored, and dID is required and is used to get a rendition. If the value is <i>Latest</i> , the latest revision of the content item is used to compute the dID. If the value is <i>LatestReleased</i> , the latest released revision of the content item is used to compute the dID.



**Note:** Do not confuse the Content ID (dDocName) with the internal content item revision identifier (dID). The *dID* is a generated reference to a specific rendition of a content item.

# **LOGIN**

#### **Description**

This page request service forces a log in and executes an HTML page request.

- This service is used to login to the content server. If you are logging in from the browser the parameter Auth is also required.
- ❖ This service requires the name of the page to retrieve and the action to execute. If this service is unable to execute, an error message is displayed to the user.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
Action	The action to execute. Usually set to GetTemplatePage.
IdcService	Must be set to LOGIN
Page	The HTML page requested.

#### **Additional Parameters**

This parameters may be required:

Parameter	Description
Auth	Required when logging in from a browser interface.
	For example:
	Auth=Internet

# **Example**

Displays the home page when you login to the content server:

IdcService=LOGIN

Page=HOME\_PAGE

# **MERGE\_TABLE**

#### **Description**

This service allows the user to add rows to any table in the content server database.

- ❖ Given a table name in the system and a result set with the same name, the service will attempt to insert or update the rows in the specified table.
- ❖ If no constraints are defined, the service will attempt to insert the row.
- ❖ If constraints are defined, the service will first do a lookup and if the designated row is found, an update is performed. Otherwise, the row will be inserted.
- All errors are logged to the content server log. If this service is unable to execute, an error message is displayed to the user.



Important: By default, this service is not error tolerant and does not execute the merge in a transaction. Consequently, if the isErrorTolerant or isTransactional flags are not set to TRUE and if the service encounters an error, it will abort where the error occurred and not rollback the already updated and inserted rows. In this situation, if you do not specify constraints and rerun the merge table, the merge will fail in Microsoft SQL Server and ORACLE due to constraint violation.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to MERGE_TABLE.
tableName	The name of the table to merge.



**Important:** The ResultSet definition for the table containing the rows to insert or update must also be specified.

# **Optional Parameters**

These optional parameters may be specified:

constraintKeys	Specifies a comma-separated list of column names used as unique identifiers. The service will initially do a look up with these constraints. If the row is found, the service does an update. Otherwise, a new row is inserted.
isDeleteTable	If TRUE, the service deletes the table before attempting the merge. The delete is performed in a transaction with the merge, if isTransactional is TRUE. By default, this value is FALSE.
isErrorTolerant	If TRUE, will not abort when errors are encountered during the merge. By default, this value is FALSE.
isTransactional	If TRUE, the merge is performed in a transaction. If an error occurs during the merge and isErrorTolerant is FALSE, the merge will abort and rollback all the changes. By default, this value is FALSE.

- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: Unable to notify "{InstanceMenuLabel}" of change.



**Caution:** Using duplicate IDC\_Name collection names will cause data corruption. The Archiver cannot be used to move or copy data between two instances that share the same IDC\_Name. To do so will corrupt the data on the target system.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IDC_Name	The name of the content server instance.
IdcService	Must be set to NOTIFY_CHANGE.

### **Example**

IdcService=NOTIFY\_CHANGE

IDC\_Name=Master\_on\_server01

# **NOTIFY\_CONTRIBUTOR**

### **Description**

This workflow related service notifies a contributor.

- Given a content revision ID, the service notifies the contributor on the problem report for the specified content item.
- ❖ The most likely error is a content item no longer in the system. If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to notify on problem report for content item "{dDocName}*"

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
dID	The generated content item revision ID.
IdcService	Must be set to NOTIFY_CONTRIBUTOR.

### PAGE\_HANDLER

#### **Description**

This service rebuilds the static web layout structure as it is defined in the Web Layout Editor.

- \* Returns the entire page list in the serialized *hda*.
- ❖ This service is asynchronous and the action is performed in a background thread. This service can only be executed in the context of the server and only completes successfully if a connection is made to the server.
- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: Failed page service action.

### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

Parameter	Description
IdcService	Must be set to PAGE_HANDLER.
IsRebuild	Enables a rebuild.
	Must be set to TRUE (1) for the server to rebuild the web layout pages.
	♦ Default is FALSE (0).

This service evaluates whether a connection to the server exists.

- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to establish connection to the server.*



**Tech Tip:** Execute a PING\_SERVER request before calling other services to ensure that there is a connection to the content server and that you are logged in as a user authorized to execute commands.

- ❖ If this service is unable to execute, this message is displayed to the user: *Unable to retrieve search results*.

#### **Required Parameters**

These parameters must be specified:

QueryText	The user supplied text submitted for the content item query.
